Resolution 2017-69 - A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH H&D ENGINEERS FOR FRANKLIN RD PROJECT, UTILITY RELOCATION INSPECTION SERVICES, for adoption

Background

The City and the Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) have begun widening improvements to Franklin Road between Moores Lane and Concord Road. The planned improvements include widening the roadway from its current three lane configuration to a five lane configuration with north and south bound traffic lanes and a center turn lane.

In order for the new roadway alignment to be constructed, various utility lines must be relocated away from the planned construction area. Of these utilities, the City owns water and sewer lines within the planned construction boundary. Under TDOT regulations specific for this project, TDOT will reimburse the City for all direct construction costs associated with the relocating of water and sewer lines, up to an amount not to exceed \$3.5 million. Exceptions include costs associated with "betterment" of existing water and/or sewer lines and limitations on reimbursement for engineering inspection services.

For engineering costs, TDOT will reimburse the City for all relocation design and survey costs, but limit reimbursement of engineering inspection costs to construction work associated with water and sewer lines that currently exist within City-owned utility easements (as opposed to lines currently within the TDOT right-of-way). Below is a summary of City costs associated with water and sewer utility relocations:

As shown above, the total estimated cost to relocate water and sewer lines for the Franklin Road project is \$2.42 million. Of that amount, TDOT will reimburse the City \$2.27million, with the City incurring out-of-pocket costs of about \$155,000. The above estimated costs are pre-construction estimates. Actual costs of construction will be determined by the lowest, best bid submitted for the relocation work and project changes approved by TDOT.

Work has begun on clearing, and utility relocation work is anticipated to begin in the coming months. In order that water and sewer utility construction progress in accordance with the plans and to ensure that an accurate accounting of the contractor's monthly progress is documented, the City has included the services of a resident project representative (project inspector) in the project budget. As outlined above, inspection services for this project are estimated to be a total of \$136,152.40, of which the City's portion (not reimbursable) is \$96,668.20. For these inspection services, staff is recommending approval of an agreement with Hethcoat & Davis, Inc. (H&D) of Brentwood. H&D provided design services for this project, is very familiar with the project and has performed other work for the the City and proven to be a reliable and competent firm.

 - A. As Basic Services, Engineer shall:
 - 1. General Administration of Construction Contract: Consult with Owner and act as Owner's representative as provided in the Construction Contract. The extent and limitations of the duties, responsibilities, and authority of Engineer shall be as assigned in EJCDC® C-700, Standard General Conditions of the Construction Contract (2013 Edition), prepared by the Engineers Joint Contract Documents Committee, or other construction general conditions specified in the Agreement. If Owner, or Owner and Contractor, modify the duties, responsibilities, and authority of Engineer in the Construction Contract, or modify other terms of the Construction Contract having a direct bearing on Engineer, then Owner shall compensate Engineer for any related increases in the cost to provide Construction Phase services. Engineer shall not be required to furnish or perform services contrary to Engineer's responsibilities as a licensed professional. All of Owner's instructions to Contractor will be issued through Engineer, which shall have authority to act on behalf of Owner in dealings with Contractor to the extent provided in this Agreement and the Construction Contract except as otherwise provided in writing.
 - 2. Resident Project Representative (RPR): Provide the services of an RPR at the Site to assist the Engineer and to provide more extensive observation of Contractor's work. Duties, responsibilities, and authority of the RPR are as set forth in Exhibit D. The furnishing of such RPR's services will not limit, extend, or modify Engineer's responsibilities or authority except as expressly set forth in Exhibit D.
 - 3. Selection of Independent Testing Laboratory: Assist Owner in the selection of an independent testing laboratory to perform the testing services identified in Exhibit B, Paragraph B2.01.A.
 - 4. *Pre-Construction Conference:* Participate in a pre-construction conference prior to commencement of Work at the Site.
 - 5. *Electronic Transmittal Protocols*: If the Construction Contract Documents do not specify protocols for the transmittal of Project-related correspondence, documents, text, data, drawings,

information, and graphics, in electronic media or digital format, either directly, or through access to a secure Project website, then together with Owner and Contractor jointly develop such protocols for transmittals between and among Owner, Contractor, and Engineer during the Construction Phase and Post-Construction Phase.

- 6. Original Documents: If requested by Owner to do so, maintain and safeguard during the Construction Phase at least one original printed record version of the Construction Contract Documents, including Drawings and Specifications signed and sealed by Engineer and other design professionals in accordance with applicable Laws and Regulations. Throughout the Construction Phase, make such original printed record version of the Construction Contract Documents available to Contractor and Owner for review.
- 7. Schedules: Receive, review, and determine the acceptability of any and all schedules that Contractor is required to submit to Engineer, including the Progress Schedule, Schedule of Submittals, and Schedule of Values.
- 8. Baselines and Benchmarks: As appropriate, establish baselines and benchmarks for locating the Work which in Engineer's judgment are necessary to enable Contractor to proceed.
- 9. *Visits to Site and Observation of Construction:* In connection with observations of Contractor's Work while it is in progress:
 - a. Make visits to the Site at intervals appropriate to the various stages of construction, as Engineer deems necessary, to observe as an experienced and qualified design professional the progress of Contractor's executed Work. Such visits and observations by Engineer, and the Resident Project Representative, if any, are not intended to be exhaustive or to extend to every aspect of the Work or to involve detailed inspections of the Work beyond the responsibilities specifically assigned to Engineer in the Agreement, this Task Order, and the Construction Contract Documents, but rather are to be limited to spot checking, selective sampling, and similar methods of general observation of the Work based on Engineer's exercise of professional judgment, as assisted by the Resident Project Representative, if any. Based on information obtained during such visits and observations, Engineer will determine in general if the Work is proceeding in accordance with the Construction Contract Documents, and Engineer shall keep Owner informed of the progress of the Work.
 - b. The purpose of Engineer's visits to the Site, and representation by the Resident Project Representative, if any, at the Site, will be to enable Engineer to better carry out the duties and responsibilities assigned to and undertaken by Engineer during the Construction Phase, and, in addition, by the exercise of Engineer's efforts as an experienced and qualified design professional, to provide for Owner a greater degree of confidence that the completed Work will conform in general to the Construction Contract Documents and that Contractor has implemented and maintained the integrity of the design concept of the completed Project as a functioning whole as indicated in the Construction Contract Documents. Engineer shall not, during such visits or as a result of such observations of the Work, supervise, direct, or have control over the Work, nor shall Engineer have authority over or responsibility for the means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures of construction selected or used by any Constructor, for security or safety at the Site, for safety precautions and programs incident to any Constructor's work in progress, for the coordination of the Constructors' work or

schedules, nor for any failure of any Constructor to comply with Laws and Regulations applicable to furnishing and performing of its work. Accordingly, Engineer neither guarantees the performance of any Constructor nor assumes responsibility for any Constructor's failure to furnish or perform the Work, or any portion of the Work, in accordance with the Construction Contract Documents.

- 10. Defective Work: Reject Work if, on the basis of Engineer's observations, Engineer be lieves that such Work is defective under the terms and standards set forth in the Construction Contract Documents. Provide recommendations to Owner regarding whether Contractor should correct such Work or remove and replace such Work, or whether Owner should consider accepting such Work as provided in the Construction Contract Documents.
- 11. Compatibility with Design Concept: If Engineer has express knowledge that a specific part of the Work that is not defective under the terms and standards set forth in the Construction Contract Documents is nonetheless not compatible with the design concept of the completed Project as a functioning whole, then inform Owner of such incompatibility, and provide recommendations for addressing such Work.
- 12. Clarifications and Interpretations: Accept from Contractor and Owner submittal of all matters in question concerning the requirements of the Construction Contract Documents (sometimes referred to as requests for information or interpretation—RFIs), or relating to the acceptability of the Work under the Construction Contract Documents. With reasonable promptness, render a written clarification, interpretation, or decision on the issue submitted, or initiate an amendment or supplement to the Construction Contract Documents.
- 13. *Field Orders:* Subject to any limitations in the Construction Contract Documents, Engineer may prepare and issue Field Orders requiring minor changes in the Work.
- 14. Change Orders and Work Change Directives: Recommend Change Orders and Work Change Directives to Owner, as appropriate, and prepare Change Orders and Work Change Directives as required.
- 15. Differing Site Conditions: Respond to any notice from Contractor of differing site conditions, including conditions relating to underground facilities such as utilities, and hazardous environmental conditions. Promptly conduct reviews, obtain information, and prepare findings, conclusions, and recommendations for Owner's use, subject to the limitations and responsibilities under the Agreement and the Construction Contract.
- 16. Non-reviewable matters: If a submitted matter in question concerns the Engineer's performance of its duties and obligations, or terms and conditions of the Construction Contract Documents that do not involve (1) the performance or acceptability of the Work under the Construction Contract Documents, (2) the design (as set forth in the Drawings, Specifications, or otherwise), or (3) other engineering or technical matters, then Engineer will promptly give written notice to Owner and Contractor that Engineer will not provide a decision or interpretation.
- 17. Shop Drawings, Samples, and Other Submittals: Review and approve or take other appropriate action with respect to Shop Drawings, Samples, and other required Contractor submittals, but only for conformance with the information given in the Construction Contract Documents and

compatibility with the design concept of the completed Project as a functioning whole as indicated by the Construction Contract Documents. Such reviews and approvals or other action will not extend to means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures of construction or to safety precautions and programs incident thereto. Engineer shall meet any Contractor's submittal schedule that Engineer has accepted.

18. Substitutes and "or-equal": Evaluate and determine the acceptability of substitute or "or-equal" materials and equipment proposed by Contractor, but subject to the provisions of Paragraph A2.01.B.2 of this Exhibit A.

19. Inspections and Tests:

- a. Receive and reviewall certificates of inspections, tests, and approvals required by Laws and Regulations or the Construction Contract Documents. Engineer's review of such certificates will be for the purpose of determining that the results certified indicate compliance with the Construction Contract Documents and will not constitute an independent evaluation that the content or procedures of such inspections, tests, or approvals comply with the requirements of the Construction Contract Documents. Engineer shall be entitled to rely on the results of such inspections and tests.
- b. As deemed reasonably necessary, request that Contractor uncover Work that is to be inspected, tested, or approved.
- Pursuant to the terms of the Construction Contract, require additional inspections or testing
 of the Work, whether or not the Work is fabricated, installed, or completed.
- 20. Change Proposals and Claims: (a) Review and respond to Change Proposals. Review each duly submitted Change Proposal from Contractor and, within 30 days after receipt of the Contractor's supporting data, either deny the Change Proposal in whole, approve it in whole, or deny it in part and approve it in part. Such actions shall be in writing, with a copy provided to Owner and Contractor. If the Change Proposal does not involve the design (as set forth in the Drawings, Specifications, or otherwise), the acceptability of the Work, or other engineering or technical matters, then Engineer will notify the parties that the Engineer will not resolve the Change Proposal. (b) Provide information or data to Owner regarding engineering or technical matters pertaining to Claims.
- 21. Applications for Payment: Based on Engineer's observations as an experienced and qualified design professional and on review of Applications for Payment and accompanying supporting documentation:
 - reductions in payment (set-offs) based on the provisions for set-offs stated in the Construction Contract. Such recommendations of payment will be in writing and will constitute Engineer's representation to Owner, based on such observations and review, that, to the best of Engineer's knowledge, information and belief, Contractor's Work has progressed to the point indicated, the Work is generally in accordance with the Construction Contract Documents (subject to an evaluation of the Work as a functioning whole prior to or upon Substantial Completion, to the results of any subsequent tests called for in the

Construction Contract Documents, and to any other qualifications stated in the recommendation), and the conditions precedent to Contractor's being entitled to such payment appear to have been fulfilled in so far as it is Engineer's responsibility to observe the Work. In the case of unit price work, Engineer's recommendations of payment will include final determinations of quantities and classifications of the Work (subject to any subsequent adjustments allowed by the Construction Contract Documents).

- By recommending payment, Engineer shall not thereby be deemed to have represented that observations made by Engineer to check the quality or quantity of Contractor's Work as it is performed and furnished have been exhaustive, extended to every aspect of Contractor's Work in progress, or involved detailed inspections of the Work beyond the responsibilities specifically assigned to Engineer in the Agreement or this Task Order. Neither Engineer's review of Contractor's Work for the purposes of recommending payments nor Engineer's recommendation of any payment including final payment will impose on Engineer responsibility to supervise, direct, or control the Work, or for the means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures of construction or safety precautions or programs incident thereto, or Contractor's compliance with Laws and Regulations applicable to Contractor's furnishing and performing the Work. It will also not impose responsibility on Engineer to make any examination to ascertain how or for what purposes Contractor has used the money paid to Contractor by Owner; to determine that title to any portion of the Work, including materials or equipment, has passed to Owner free and clear of any liens, claims, security interests, or encumbrances; or that there may not be other matters at issue between Owner and Contractor that might affect the amount that should be paid.
- 22. Contractor's Completion Documents: Receive from Contractor, review, and transmit to Owner maintenance and operating instructions, schedules, guarantees, bonds, certificates or other evidence of insurance required by the Construction Contract Documents, certificates of inspection, tests and approvals, and Shop Drawings, Samples, and other data approved as provided under Paragraph A1.05.A.17. Receive from Contractor, review, and transmit to Owner the annotated record documents which are to be assembled by Contractor in accordance with the Construction Contract Documents to obtain final payment. The extent of Engineer's review of record documents shall be to check that Contractor has submitted all pages.
- 23. Substantial Completion: Promptly after notice from Contractor that Contractor considers the entire Work ready for its intended use, in company with Owner and Contractor, visit the Site to review the Work and determine the status of completion. Follow the procedures in the Construction Contract regarding the preliminary certificate of Substantial Completion, punch list of items to be completed, Owner's objections, notice to Contractor, and issuance of a final certificate of Substantial Completion. Assist Owner regarding any remaining engineering or technical matters affecting Owner's use or occupancy of the Work following Substantial Completion.
- 24. Final Notice of Acceptability of the Work: Conduct a final visit to the specific Project to determine if the Work is complete and acceptable so that Engineer may recommend, in writing, final payment to Contractor. Accompanying the recommendation for final payment, Engineer shall also provide a notice to Owner and Contractor in the form attached hereto as Exhibit E ("Notice of Acceptability of Work") (also available as a construction form, EJCDC® C-626 (2013)) that the Work is acceptable (subject to the provisions of the Notice and Paragraph A1.05.A.21.b) to the best of

Engineer's knowledge, information, and belief, and based on the extent of the services provided by Engineer under the Agreement and this Task Order.

- 25. Standards for Certain Construction-Phase Decisions: Engineer will render decisions regarding the requirements of the Construction Contract Documents, and judge the acceptability of the Work, pursuant to the specific procedures set forth in the Construction Contract for initial interpretations, Change Proposals, and acceptance of the Work. In rendering such decisions and judgments, Engineer will not show partiality to Owner or Contractor, and will not be liable to Owner, Contractor, or others in connection with any proceedings, interpretations, decisions, or judgments conducted or rendered in good faith.
- B. Duration of Construction Phase: The Construction Phase will commence with the execution of the first Construction Contract for the specific Project or any part thereof and will terminate upon written recommendation by Engineer for final payment to Contractors. If the specific Project involves more than one prime contract as indicated in Paragraph A1.03.C, then Construction Phase services may be rendered at different times in respect to the separate contracts. Subject to the provisions of Article 3, Engineer shall be entitled to an equitable increase in compensation if Construction Phase services (including Resident Project Representative services, if any) are required after the original date for completion and readiness for final payment of Contractor as set forth in the final Construction Contract under the Task Order.
- A1.06 Post-Construction Phase Not included in this Task Amendment
- A1.07 Commissioning Phase Not included in this Task Amendment
- A1.08 *Other Services:* Each specific Task Order may include Basic Services that do not fit into the categories above. Such services should be expressly stated in the specific Task Order itself.

PART 2—ADDITIONAL SERVICES

- A2.01 Additional Services Requiring an Amendment to Task Order
 - A. Advance Written Authorization Required: During performance under a Task Order, Owner may authorize Engineer in writing to furnish or obtain from others Additional Services of the types listed below. Unless expressly indicated above or in the specific Task Order to be included Basic Services, the following services are not included as part of Basic Services and will be paid for by Owner as Additional Services, using the basis of compensation for Additional Services, as indicated in the specific Task Order.
 - Preparation of applications and supporting documents (in addition to those furnished under Basic Services) for private or governmental grants, loans, or advances in connection with the Specific Project; preparation or review of environmental assessments and impact statements; review and evaluation of the effects on the design requirements for the Specific Project of any such statements and documents prepared by others; and assistance in obtaining approvals of authorities having jurisdiction over the anticipated environmental impact of the Specific Project.
 - Services to make measured drawings of existing conditions or facilities, to conduct tests or investigations of existing conditions or facilities, or to verify the accuracy of drawings or other information furnished by Owner or others.

- 3. Services resulting from significant changes in the scope, extent, or character of the portions of the Specific Project designed or specified by Engineer, or the Specific Project's design requirements, including, but not limited to, changes in size, complexity, Owner's schedule, character of construction, or method of financing; and revising previously accepted studies, reports, Drawings, Specifications, or Construction Contract Documents when such revisions are required by changes in Laws and Regulations enacted subsequent to the Effective Date of the Task Order or are due to any other causes beyond Engineer's control.
- 4. Services resulting from Owner's request to evaluate additional Study and Report Phase alternative solutions beyond those agreed to in Paragraph A1.01.A.1 and 2.
- 5. Services required as a result of Owner's providing incomplete or incorrect Specific Project information to Engineer.
- 6. Providing renderings or models for Owner's use, including services in support of building information modeling or civil integrated management.
- 7. Undertaking investigations and studies including, but not limited to:
 - a. detailed consideration of operations, maintenance, and overhead expenses;
 - b. based on the engineering and technical aspects of the Project, the preparation of feasibility studies (such as those that include projections of output capacity, utility project rates, project market demand, or project revenues) and cash flow analyses, provided that such services do not include rendering advice regarding municipal financial products or the issuance of municipal securities;
 - c. preparation of appraisals;
 - d. evaluating processes available for licensing, and assisting Owner in obtaining process licensing;
 - e. detailed quantity surveys of materials, equipment, and labor; and
 - f. audits or inventories required in connection with construction performed or furnished by Owner.
- 8. Furnishing services of Consultants for other than Basic Services.
- 9. Providing data or services of the types described in Exhibit B, when Owner retains Engineer to provide such data or services instead of Owner furnishing the same.
- 10. Providing the following services:
 - a. Services attributable to more prime construction contracts than specified in Paragraph A1.03.C or the specific Task Order.
 - b. Services to arrange for performance of construction services for Owner by contractors other than the principal prime Contractor, and administering Owner's contract for such services.

- 11. Services during out-of-town travel required of Engineer, other than for visits to the Site or Owner's office as required in Basic Services.
- 12. Preparing for, coordinating with, participating in and responding to structured independent review processes, including, but not limited to, construction management, cost estimating, project peer review, value engineering, and constructibility review requested by Owner; and performing or furnishing services required to revise studies, reports, Drawings, Specifications, or other documents as a result of such review processes.
- 13. Preparing additional bidding-related documents (or requests for proposals or other construction procurement documents) or Construction Contract Documents for alternate bids or cost estimates requested by Owner for the Work or a portion thereof.
- 14. Assistance in connection with bid protests, rebidding, or renegotiating contracts for construction, materials, equipment, or services, except when such assistance is required to complete services required by Paragraph 5.02.A and Exhibit F.
- 15. Preparing conformed Construction Contract Documents that incorporate and integrate the content of all Addenda and any amendments negotiated by Owner and Contractor.
- 16. Providing Construction Phase services beyond the original date for completion and readiness for final payment of Contractor, but only if such services increase the total quantity of services to be performed in the Construction Phase, rather than merely shifting performance of such services to a later date.
- 17. Preparing Record Drawings, and furnishing such Record Drawings to Owner.
- 18. Supplementing Record Drawings with information regarding the completed Project, Site, and immediately adjacent areas obtained from field observations, Owner, utility companies, and other reliable sources.
- 19. Conducting surveys, investigations, and field measurements to verify the accuracy of Record Drawing content obtained from Contractor, Owner, utility companies, and other sources; revise and supplement Record Drawings as needed.
- 20. Preparation of operation, maintenance, and staffing manuals.
- 21. Protracted or extensive assistance in refining and adjusting of Project equipment and systems (such as initial startup, testing, and balancing).
- 22. Assistance to Owner in training Owner's staff to operate and maintain Specific Project equipment and systems.
- 23. Assistance to Owner in developing systems and procedures for (a) control of the operation and maintenance of Project equipment and systems, and (b) related recordkeeping.
- 24. Preparing to serve or serving as a consultant or witness for Owner in any litigation, arbitration, mediation, lien or bond claim, or other legal or administrative proceeding involving the Project.

- 25. Overtime work requiring higher than regular rates.
- 26. Providing construction surveys and staking to enable Contractor to perform its work other than as required under Paragraph A1.05.A.8, and any type of property surveys or related engineering services needed for the transfer of interests in real property; and providing other special field surveys.
- 27. Providing more extensive services required to enable Engineer to issue notices or certifications requested by Owner.
- 28. Excessive services during any correction period, or with respect to guarantees called for in the Construction Contract (except as agreed to under Basic Services).
- 29. Provide assistance in responding to the presence of any Constituent of Concern at any Site, in compliance with current Laws and Regulations.
- 30. Other additional services performed or furnished by Engineer not otherwise provided for in this Agreement.
- B. Advance Written Authorization Not Required: Engineer shall advise Owner in advance that Engineer will immediately commence to perform or furnish the Additional Services of the types listed below. For such Additional Services, Engineer need not request or obtain specific advance written authorization from Owner. Engineer shall cease performing or furnishing such Additional Services upon receipt of written notice from Owner. Unless expressly indicated above or in the specific Task Order to be included Basic Services, the following services are not included as part of Basic Services and will be paid for by Owner as Additional Services, using the basis of compensation for Additional Services, as indicated in the specific Task Order.
 - 1. Services in connection with Work Change Directives and Change Orders to reflect changes requested by Owner.
 - 2. Services in making revisions to Drawings and Specifications occasioned by the acceptance of substitute materials or equipment other than "or equal" items; services after the award of the Construction Contract in evaluating and determining the acceptability of a proposed "or equal" or substitution which is found to be inappropriate for the Project; evaluation and determination of an excessive number of proposed "or equals" or substitutions, whether proposed before or after award of the Construction Contract.
 - 3. Services resulting from significant delays, changes, or price increases occurring as a direct or indirect result of materials, equipment, or energy shortages.
 - 4. Additional or extended services arising from (a) the presence at the Site of any Constituent of Concern or items of historical or cultural significance, (b) emergencies or acts of God endangering the Work, (c) damage to the Work by fire or other causes during construction, (d) a significant amount of defective, neglected, or delayed Work, (e) acceleration of the progress schedule involving services beyond normal working hours, or (f) default by Contractor.

- 5. Services (other than Basic Services during the Post-Construction Phase) in connection with any partial utilization of the Work by Owner prior to Substantial Completion.
- 6. Evaluating unreasonable or frivolous requests for interpretation or information (RFIs), Change Proposals, or other demands from Contractor or others in connection with the Work, or an excessive number of RFIs, Change Proposals, or demands.
- 7. Reviewing a Shop Drawing or other Contractor submittal more than three times, as a result of repeated in adequate submissions by Contractor.
- 8. While at the Site, compliance by Engineer and its staff with those terms of Owner's or Contractor's safety program provided to Engineer subsequent to the Effective Date that exceed those normally required of engineering personnel by federal, State, or local safety authorities for similar construction sites.

Payments to Engineer for Services and Reimbursable Expenses

Article 2 of the Agreement is amended and supplemented to include the following agreement of the parties:

ARTICLE 2 – OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

C2.01 Basis of Compensation

- A. The bases of compensation (compensation methods) for Basic Services (including if applicable the bases of compensation for individual phases of Basic Services) and for Additional Services shall be identified in each specific Task Order (see Suggested Form of Task Order, Paragraph 6). Owner shall pay Engineer for services in accordance with the applicable basis of compensation.
- B. The three following bases of compensation are used for services under the Task Orders, as identified in each specific Task Order:
 - 1. Lump Sum (plus any expenses expressly eligible for reimbursement)
 - 2. Standard Hourly Rates (plus any expenses expressly eligible for reimbursement) in accordance with TDOT format.
 - Direct Labor Costs Times a Factor (plus any expenses expressly eligible for reimbursement)

C2.02 Explanation of Compensation Methods

- A. Lump Sum-Not Applicable
- B. Standard Hourly Rates
 - For the specified category of services, the Owner shall pay Engineer an amount equal to the cumulative hours charged to the Specific Project by each class of Engineer's employees times Standard Hourly Rates for each applicable billing class. Under this method, Engineer shall also be entitled to reimbursement from Owner for the expenses identified in Paragraph C2.03 below, and Appendix 1.
 - 2. Standard Hourly Rates include salaries and wages paid to personnel in each billing class plus the cost of customary and statutory benefits, general and administrative overhead, non-project operating costs, and operating margin or profit.
 - 3. Engineer's Reimbursable Expenses Schedule and Standard Hourly Rates are as set forth on the TDOT Utility Relocation Contract.

- 4. The total estimated compensation for the specified category of services shall be stated in the Task Order. This total estimated compensation will incorporate all labor at Standard Hourly Rates, and reimbursable expenses (including Consultants' charges, if any).
- 5. The amounts billed will be based on the cumulative hours charged to the specified category of services on the Specific Project during the billing period by each class of Engineer's employees times Standard Hourly Rates for each applicable billing class, plus reimbursable expenses (including Consultant's charges, if any).
- 6. The Standard Hourly Rates and Reimbursable Expenses Schedule shall be adjusted annually (as of [--]) to reflect equitable changes in the compensation payable to Engineer.
- C. Direct Labor Costs Times a Factor Not applicable.

C2.03 Reimbursable Expenses

- A. Deleted

Expenses eligible for reimbursement under the Direct Labor Costs Times a Factor and Standard Hourly Rate methods of compensation include the following expenses reasonably and necessarily incurred by Engineer in connection with the performing or furnishing of Basic and Additional Services for the Task Order: transportation (including mileage), lodging, and subsistence incidental thereto; providing and maintaining field office facilities including furnishings and utilities; toll telephone calls, mobile phone services, and courier services; reproduction of reports, Drawings, Specifications, bidding-related or other procurement documents, Construction Contract Documents, and similar Specific Project-related items; Consultant charges; and any other expenses identified in Appendix 1.
- C. Reimbursable expenses reasonably and necessarily incurred in connection with services provided under the Direct Labor Costs Times a Factor and Standard Hourly Rate methods shall be paid at the rates set forth in Appendix 1, Reimbursable Expenses Schedule, subject to the factors set forth below.

C2.04 Serving as a Witness

A. For services performed by Engineer's employees as witnesses giving testimony in any litigation, arbitration or other legal or administrative proceeding under Paragraph A2.01.A.20, at a rate of [] times the witness's standard hourly rate. Compensation for Consultants for such services will be by reimbursement of Consultants' reasonable charges to Engineer for such services.

C2.05 Other Provisions Concerning Payment

A. Extended Contract Times: Should the Contract Times to complete the Work be extended beyond the period stated in the Task Order, payment for Engineer's services shall be continued based on the Standard Hourly Rates Method of Payment.

B. Estimated Compensation Amounts

- 1. Engineer's estimate of the amounts that will become payable for services are only estimates for planning purposes, are not binding on the parties, and are not the minimum or maximum amounts payable to Engineer under the Agreement.
- 2. When estimated compensation amounts have been stated in a Task Order and it subsequently becomes apparent to Engineer that a compensation amount thus estimated will be exceeded, Engineer shall give Owner written notice thereof. Promptly thereafter Owner and Engineer shall review the matter of services remaining to be performed and compensation for such services. Owner shall either agree to such compensation exceeding said estimated amount or Owner and Engineer shall agree to a reduction in the remaining services to be rendered by Engineer so that total compensation for such services will not exceed said estimated amount when such services are completed. If Engineer exceeds the estimated amount before Owner and Engineer have agreed to an increase in the compensation due Engineer or a reduction in the remaining services, the Engineer shall give written notice thereof to Owner and shall be paid for all services rendered thereafter.

This is **EXHIBIT D**, consisting of 5 pages, referred to in and part of the **Agreement between Owner and Engineer for Professional Services – Task Order Edition** dated September 5, 2017.

Schedule of Duties, Responsibilities, and Limitations of Authority of Resident Project Representative

The following duties, responsibilities, and limitations of authority may be incorporated in the Task Order for a Specific Project:

D1.01 Resident Project Representative

- A. Engineer shall furnish a Resident Project Representative ("RPR") to assist Engineer in observing progress and quality of the Work. The RPR may provide full time representation or may provide representation to a lesser degree. RPR is Engineer's representative at the Site, will act as directed by and under the supervision of Engineer, and will confer with Engineer regarding RPR's actions.
- B. Through RPR's observations of the Work, including field checks of materials and installed equipment, Engineer shall endeavor to provide further protection for Owner against defects and deficiencies in the Work. However, Engineer shall not, as a result of such RPR observations of the Work, supervise, direct, or have control over the Work, nor shall Engineer (including the RPR) have authority over or responsibility for the means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures of construction selected or used by any Constructor, for security or safety at the Site, for safety precautions and programs incident to the Work or any Constructor's work in progress, for the coordination of the Constructors' work or schedules, or for any failure of any Constructor to comply with Laws and Regulations applicable to the performing and furnishing of its work. The Engineer (including RPR) neither guarantees the performances of any Constructor nor assumes responsibility for any Constructor's failure to furnish and perform the Work, or any portion of the Work, in accordance with the Construction Contract Documents. In addition, the specific terms set forth in Exhibit A, Paragraph A1.05, as incorporated in this Task Order, are applicable.
- C. The duties and responsibilities of the RPR are as follows:
 - General: RPR's dealings in matterspertaining to the Work in general shall be with Engineer and Contractor. RPR's dealings with Subcontractors shall only be throughor with the full knowledge and approval of Contractor. RPR shall generally communicate with Owner only with the knowledge of and under the direction of Engineer.
 - Schedules: Review the progress schedule, schedule of Shop Drawing and Sample submittals, schedule of values, and other schedules prepared by Contractor and consult with Engineer concerning acceptability of such schedules.
 - Conferences and Meetings: Attend meetings with Contractor, such as preconstruction conferences, progress meetings, job conferences, and other Project-related meetings (but not including Contractor's safety meetings), and as appropriate prepare and circulate copies of minutes thereof.

Exhibit D – Duties, Responsibilities, and Limitations of Authority of Resident Project Representative EJCDC® E-505, Agreement Between Owner and Engineer for Professional Services – Task Order Edition.

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4. Safety Compliance: Comply with Site safety programs, as they apply to RPR, and if required to do so by such safety programs, receive safety training specifically related to RPR's own personal safety while at the Site.

5. Liaison

- a. Serve as Engineer's liaison with Contractor. Working principally through Contractor's authorized representative or designee, assist in providing information regarding the provisions and intent of the Construction Contract Documents.
- b. Assist Engineer in serving as Owner's liaison with Contractor when Contractor's operations affect Owner's on-Site operations.
- c. Assist in obtaining from Owner additional details or information, when required for proper execution of the Work.
- 6. Clarifications and Interpretations: Receive from Contractor submittal of any matters in question concerning the requirements of the Construction Contract Documents (sometimes referred to as requests for information or interpretation—RFIs), or relating to the acceptability of the Work under the Construction Contract Documents. Report to Engineer regarding such RFIs. Report to Engineer when clarifications and interpretations of the Construction Contract Documents are needed, whether as the result of a Contractor RFI or otherwise. Transmit Engineer's clarifications, interpretations, and decisions to Contractor.

7. Shop Drawings and Samples

- a. Record date of receipt of Samples and Contractor-approved Shop Drawings.
- b. Receive Samples that are furnished at the Site by Contractor, and notify Engineer of availability of Samples for examination.
- c. Advise Engineer and Contractor of the commencement of any portion of the Work requiring a Shop Drawing or Sample submittal, if RPR believes that the submittal has not been received from Contractor, or has not been approved by Contractor or Engineer.
- 8. *Proposed Modifications:* Consider and evaluate Contractor's suggestions for modifications to the Drawings or Specifications, and report such suggestions, together with RPR's recommendations, if any, to Engineer. Transmit Engineer's response (if any) to such suggestions to Contractor.

9. Review of Work; Defective Work

- a. Report to Engineer whenever RPR believes that any part of the Work is defective under the terms and standards set forth in the Construction Contract Documents, and provide recommendations as to whether such Work should be corrected, removed and replaced, or accepted as provided in the Construction Contract Documents.
- b. Inform Engineer of any Work that RPR believes is not defective under the terms and standards set forth in the Construction Contract Documents, but is nonetheless not

- compatible with the design concept of the completed Project as a functioning whole, and provide recommendations to Engineer for addressing such Work; and
- c. Advise Engineer of that part of the Work that RPR believes should be uncovered for observation, or requires special testing, inspection, or approval.

10. Inspections, Tests, and System Start-ups

- a. Consult with Engineer in advance of scheduled inspections, tests, and systems start-ups.
- b. Verify that tests, equipment, and systems start-ups and operating and maintenance training are conducted in the presence of appropriate Owner's personnel, and that Contractor maintains adequate records thereof.
- c. Observe, record, and report to Engineer appropriate details relative to the test procedures and systems start-ups.
- d. Observe whether Contractor has arranged for inspections required by Laws and Regulations, including but not limited to those to be performed by public or other agencies having jurisdiction over the Work.
- e. Accompany visiting inspectors representing public or other agencies having jurisdiction over the Work, record the results of these inspections, and report to Engineer.

11. Records

- a. Maintain at the Site orderly files for correspondence, reports of job conferences, copies of Construction Contract Documents including all Change Orders, Field Orders, Work Change Directives, Addenda, additional Drawings issued subsequent to the execution of the Construction Contract, RFIs, Engineer's clarifications and interpretations of the Construction Contract Documents, progress reports, Shop Drawingand Sample submittals received from and delivered to Contractor, and other Project-related documents.
- b. Prepare a daily report or keep a diary or log book, recording Contractor's hours on the Site, Subcontractors present at the Site, weather conditions, data relative to questions of Change Orders, Field Orders, Work Change Directives, or changed conditions, Site visitors, deliveries of equipment or materials, daily activities, decisions, observations in general, and specific observations in more detail as in the case of observing test procedures; and send copies to Engineer.
- c. Upon request from Owner to Engineer, photograph or video work in progress or Site conditions.
- d. Record and maintain accurate, up-to-date lists of the names, addresses, fax numbers, e-mail addresses, websites, and telephone numbers (including mobile numbers) of all Contractors, Subcontractors, and major Suppliers of materials and equipment.
- e. Maintain records for use in preparing Specific Project documentation.

f. Upon completion of the Work, furnish original set of all RPR Project documentation to Engineer.

12. Reports

- Furnish to Engineer periodic reports as required of progress of the Work and of Contractor's compliance with the progress schedule and schedule of Shop Drawing and Sample submittals.
- b. Draft and recommend to Engineer proposed Change Orders, Work Change Directives, and Field Orders. Obtain backup material from Contractor.
- c. Furnish to Engineer and Owner copies of all inspection, test, and system start-up reports.
- d. Immediately inform Engineer of the occurrence of any Site accidents, emergencies, acts of God endangering the Work, possible force majeure or delay events, damage to property by fire or other causes, or the discovery of any potential differing site condition or Constituent of Concern.
- 13. Payment Requests: Review applications for payment with Contractor for compliance with the established procedure for their submission and forward with recommendations to Engineer, TDOT noting particularly the relationship of the payment requested to the schedule of values, Work completed, and materials and equipment delivered at the Site but not incorporated in the Work.
- 14. Certificates, Operation and Maintenance Manuals: During the course of the Work, verify that materials and equipment certificates, operation and maintenance manuals and other data required by the Contract Documents to be assembled and furnished by Contractor are applicable to the items actually installed and in accordance with the Contract Documents, and have these documents delivered to Engineer for review and forwarding to Owner prior to payment for that part of the Work.

15. Completion:

- a. Participate in Engineer's visits to the Site regarding Substantial Completion, assist in the determination of Substantial Completion, and prior to the issuance of a Certificate of Substantial Completion, submit a punch list of observed items requiring completion or correction.
- b. Participate in Engineer's visit to the Site in the company of, Owner, and Contractor, to determine completion of the Work, and prepare a final punch list of items to be completed or corrected by Contractor.
- c. Observe whether all items on the final punch list have been completed or corrected, and make recommendations to Engineer concerning acceptance and issuance of the Notice of Acceptability of the Work (Exhibit E).
- D. Resident Project Representative shall not:
 - 1. Authorize any deviation from the Construction Contract Documents or substitution of materials or equipment (including "or-equal" items).

- 2. Exceed limitations of Engineer's authority as set forth in this Agreement.
- 3. Undertake any of the responsibilities of Contractor, Subcontractors, or Suppliers, or any Constructor.
- 4. Advise on, issue directions relative to, or assume control over any aspect of the means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures of the Work, by Contractor or any other Constructor.
- 5. Advise on, issue directions regarding, or assume control over security or safety practices, precautions, and programs in connection with the activities or operations of Owner or Contractor.
- 6. Participate in specialized field or laboratory tests or inspections conducted off-site by others except as specifically authorized by Engineer.
- 7. Accept Shop Drawing or Sample submittals from anyone other than Contractor.
- 8. Authorize Owner to occupy the Specific Project in whole or in part.

Background

The Police Department requests approval for the purchase of eight (8) Stalker Dual Pro radar units. This purchase is in conjunction with replacement of eight (8) police vehicles.

Applied Concepts, Inc. is the vendor that has been awarded the Tennessee State purchasing contract for radar units. Stalker radar is the standardized radar currently in use in all Police Department vehicles.

Six (6) Stalker Dual Pro radar units will be installed in Dodge Chargers at a cost of \$1,823.70 per unit. One (1) Stalker Dual Pro will be installed in a Ford Utility Interceptor at the same cost of \$1,823.70. Approval of Letter to Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) Outlining Development of an ADA Transition Plan

Background

Public rights-of-way and facilities are required to be accessible to persons with disabilities under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA). These statutes prohibit public agencies from discriminating against persons with disabilities by excluding them from services, programs, or activities. Public agencies must provide pedestrian access for persons with disabilities to the agency's streets and sidewalks. Regulations implement this requirement by imposing standards for accessible features such as curb cuts, ramps, continuous sidewalks, and detectable warnings.

The ADA requires public agencies with more than 50 employees to develop a transition plan. The transition plan primarily identifies barriers and deficiencies noted throughout the agency's facilities, rights of way and programs. While these laws have existed for some time, the Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) and the Federal Highway Administration have recently notified all cities and counties with 50 or more employees that having an ADA Transition Plan will be a requirement in order to receive future federal/state funding. (See attached letter dated November 14, 2016.) The letter sets specific target dates for preparing a transition plan, including a letter from the Mayor outlining preparation of a transition plan. The letter must be approved by the City's governing body and submitted by the end of the 2017 calendar year.

As noted in the letter, staff has been working on the transition plan for the past year or so. While some cities have elected to use outside consultants to prepare the required plan, we are planning to do as much of the work as possible using in-house staff. However, some outside assistance may be needed as the plan preparation proceeds. The transition plan must include a schedule for providing access features, including curb ramps for walkways. The schedule should first provide for pedestrian access upgrades to state and local government offices and facilities, transportation facilities, places of public

accommodation, and public employers, followed by walkways serving other areas. The transition plan should accomplish the following four tasks:

- 1. Identify physical obstacles in the public agency's facilities that limit the accessibility of its programs or activities to individuals with disabilities;
- 2. Describe in detail the methods that will be used to make the facilities accessible;
- 3. Specify the schedule for taking the steps necessary to upgrade pedestrian access to meet ADA and Section 504 requirements in each year following the transition plan; and
- 4. Indicate the official responsible for implementation of the plan.

This letter also serves as notice of the deadline for submission of compliance documentation. The deadlines for submission are as follows:

December 2016

- Communities with 50 employees or more in their jurisdiction must provide TDOT with documentation stating they have named a qualified person as their ADA Coordinator
- Communities must provide TDOT the Coordinator's contact information
- Communities must develop and publish an ADA grievance procedure

December 2017

- Communities must provide a written letter from the Mayor outlining the development of their Transition Plan
- Letter from the Mayor must be adopted by the City Council or County Commissioners using the city's or county's own procedures

September 2018

- Communities must provide documentation showing they have completed or are making significant progress towards completing an ADA Transition Plan and Self Evaluation
- All self-certification forms are expected to be returned to TDOT.
 Note: Projects may not be advanced within the city or county without this self-certification form

December 2019

FHWA will require all Transition Plans be completed prior to communities resigning TIP certification

Submission of these deliverables will place TDOT and your community in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Section 504. Following submission, the ADA Transition Plan Form will be received by Deborah Fleming, TDOT's Senior Regional Planner and Margaret Mahler, TDOT's ADA Coordinator. Copies of this form must accompany all applications for funding.

Reference is directed to your letter dated November 14, 2016; subject; same as above.

As requested in the referenced letter the City of Brentwood hereby submits this letter outlining development of our ADA Transition Plan. This letter was unanimously approved by the City of Brentwood Board of Commissioners at our November 13, 2017 meeting.

Approximately 10 months ago the City of Brentwood initiated a self-assessment of all City buildings and facilities accessible to the public. Findings from those assessments were documented and compiled for inclusion in the Transition Plan. We are now reviewing programs and administrative processes to ensure accessibility by persons with disabilities. The results our review will also be included in the Transition Plan.

In January of 2017 the City of Brentwood contracted with Data Transfer Solutions (DTS) to conduct a comprehensive citywide pavement condition assessment using the latest mobile video data collection technology. This roadway assessment included all curb ramps within the public right-of-way. The results of the survey will be used to identify missing curb ramps as well as non-compliant curb ramps. Deficiencies will be prioritized based on location, use and condition and included in the Transition Plan.

The City of Brentwood is committed to compliance with the ADA and plans to meet or exceed the future deadlines set forth in the referenced letter. Approval for Purchase of 5.11 Brand Responder Parkas for the Fire & Rescue Department from Municipal Emergency Services (MES) through the FireRescue GPO Cooperative

Background

At least every three years, the Fire & Rescue Department solicits bids for work uniforms. This year a committee was formed to re-evaluate current uniforms and wear-test several options from various manufacturers. One key recommendation that came out of this process was to make a change to the outerwear worn by Department personnel. Currently, the Department provides three different jackets for firefighters: a winter parka, a fleece jacket, and a raincoat. We have experienced some quality issues with our selections recently, and our current style of winter parka is being discontinued by the manufacturer, making uniformity a challenge going forward. For these reasons, a decision was made to transition to a new style of coat.

After assessing several options, it was determined that a single 3-in-1 garment produced by 5.11 meets the year-round needs of Department personnel. The coat provides a wind and water proof exterior shell that can be removed and used as an all-weather raincoat, as well as a fleece inner liner that can be worn as a separate jacket in cooler weather. When combined, these two layers provide superior cold-weather protection during the winter months. Unlike the current items in use, the Responder parka is designed specifically for public safety personnel and is Ansi 107-2015 compliant (high visibility) which eliminates the need to add a safety vest when working in situations where traffic is present.

The 5.11 brand Responder Parka is available through three local vendors, as well as directly from the 5.11 website. Each provided pricing ranging from \$245.00 to \$289.99 per coat. However one vendor, MES, is able to apply cooperative pricing through membership in the FireRescue GPO, which was approved by the City Commission last month. This will reduce the price to \$203.00 per coat if ordered in bulk for all 66 personnel at once. An additional fee of \$15.65 per garment for lettering and embroidery is charged by 5.11 regardless of vendor. Normally, individual uniform items are not brought before the City Commission since all members are given an annual allowance to spend as

needed in the annual budget. However, approval is required since this is a single order of like items totaling over \$10,000.

Please contact the Fire Chief with any questions you may have.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends approval to purchase 65 Responder parkas (5.11 brand) with associated embroidery and screen printing for the Fire & Rescue Department from Municipal Emergency Services (MES) through the FireRescue GPO cooperative. Note that the vendor has provided one parka free of charge as part of the testing process.

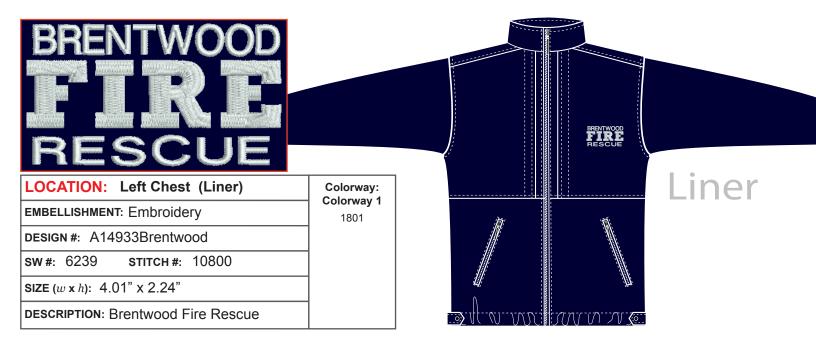

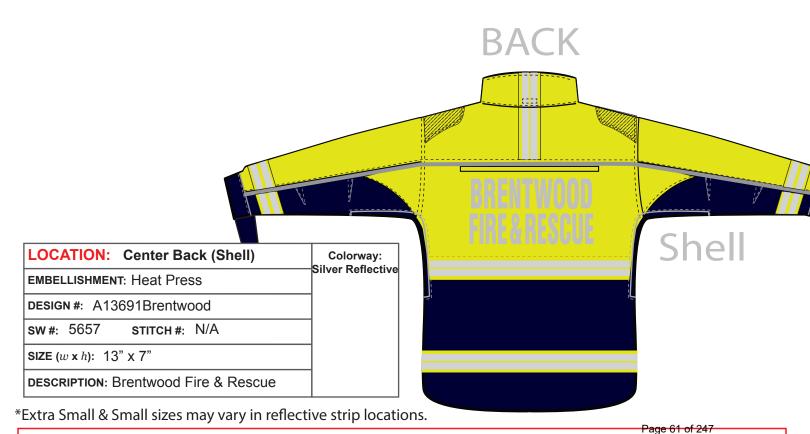

Resolution 2017-80 - A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ADOPTION OF THE PROPOSED GROUP HEALTH INSURANCE PLAN FOR CITY EMPLOYEES FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2018, for adoption

Background

Beginning in 2011, the City moved from a fully insured medical insurance plan to a partially self-insured plan in combination with the self-funded Health Reimbursement Arrangement (HRA).

The objective of this strategy is to better manage the perennial rise in health insurance costs and avoid the spikes in premiums charged by insurance companies based on limited medical claims experience. We understand that healthcare costs are projected to continue to increase in the foreseeable future and this strategy is designed to level out cost increases to manageable levels.

Basics of Partially Self-Funded Plans

In a partially self-funded plan a calculated amount of claims risk is shifted from the insurance company to the sponsor of the plan (the City) up to a predetermined maximum level. In addition, there are other costs for multiple service components in a partially self insured plan. The following are the other key components of a partially self insured plan.

- 1. **Third Party Administrator (TPA)** The City contracts with a TPA to coordinate and manage the majority of administrative aspects of the plan. The TPA processes and adjudicates all medical claims, coordinates a pharmacy benefit plan, performs utilization review for inpatient services, and handles many compliance issues, etc.
- 2. **Provider Network** As part of a partially self insured plan, a network of physicians and hospitals is provided for members to utilize for medical services at discounted rates. The important factors when considering networks are the number of doctors/hospitals and the coverage area, as well as the discount each network can offer on medical services. The higher the discount, the lower the actual claims expense paid by the City and plan participants.
- 3. **Specific Stop Loss Coverage** To limit the City's potential liability for catastrophic claims, the plan purchases an insurance policy that covers all costs of an individual's

annual claims above a predetermined maximum dollar amount (i.e. \$70,000).

4. **Aggregate Stop Loss Coverage** – Similar to the specific stop loss coverage for individual member's claims, aggregate stop loss is an insurance policy that caps the City's total liability for all claims at an agreed upon dollar amount called the "attachment point". Once total claims for the entire plan reach this attachment point, the aggregate stop loss insurance pays all additional claims costs. The attachment point is determined by the stop loss carrier's underwriters and is based on the plan's expected claims amount for the year plus a "corridor" or factor of 20-25%.

The financial aspects of a partially self-insured plan consist of both fixed and variable costs. The variable costs are the actual claims incurred by covered plan members (employees and eligible dependents) during the plan year. The fixed costs are as follows:

- □ Administrative fees paid to the TPA, charged on a Per Employee Per Month (PEPM) basis;
- □ Annual specific stop loss insurance premium;
- □ Annual aggregate stop loss premium.

When analyzing partially self-insured plans from a financial perspective, it is necessary to add the fixed costs listed above to the attachment point of the aggregate stop loss coverage. This determines the City's maximum liability for the plan year. *In this partially self-insured arrangement, the City has the opportunity to save money if claims expense is less than projected while capping the maximum liability if claims are higher than expected.*

2017 Medical Plan Status

Actual claims experience and related costs in the first ten months of the 2017 is at approximately the level projected when funding strategies for 2017 were developed. This is attributed to accurately projecting claims and related expenses coupled with purchasing adequate stop-loss coverage to limit the City's liability for claims exceeding \$70,000 in a plan year. It is also a result of making regular adjustments to both the employee's and City's contributions to the insurance fund, especially in years of normal claims experience in anticipation of years with higher claims experience.

2018 Plan Analysis and Proposal

City staff, in consultation with Sherrill Morgan, the City's insurance consultant, recommends only minor adjustments to the plan for calendar year 2018.

1.) Beginning in 2017, the Board of Commissioners approved a three-year contract with Blue Cross Blue Shield of Tennessee for administrative services through December 31, 2019. The current administrative fee is \$48.63 PEPM and will remain at this level for the 2018 plan year.

At the current level of covered members (287) the annual cost of this service is projected to be \$167,500 for 2018. However, the actual cost will be determined by the actual number of covered employees throughout the year. Blue Cross also charges a separate fee of \$3.00 PEPM, or approximately \$9,500 annually for administration of the HRA portion of the medical plan. This fee will remain unchanged for 2018.

2.) Annually, the City requests competitive quotes for stop loss reinsurance to ensure we continued to receive the most competitive rates available for this coverage, which limits the City's maximum liability for medical claims incurred by plan members. Three insurance companies submitted stop-loss coverage quotes this year, including BlueRe, our current stop-loss carrier. The Board of Commissioners will consider a separate resolution during the November 13, 2017 meeting to accept a proposal with BlueRe of Tennessee for stop loss insurance in 2018.

The Blue Cross third party administrative proposal and the BlueRe reinsurance proposal for calendar year 2018 combine to provide the following maximum liability calculation:

^{**} The maximum liability amount shown above does not include medical claims that are paid through the HRA component of the health plan and are not factored into the stop loss coverage. Based on 2017 (year to date) HRA claims, staff is estimating that 2018 HRA expense will be approximately \$450,000.

While the above table shows an increase in the City's maximum liability for 2018 of \$419,400, it should be noted that only \$9,800 is a "fixed expense" increase. We expect actual claims expense (variable expense) to increase by \$300,000 in 2018 to \$2,800,000. Therefore, staff projects an increase in overall plan expenses in 2018 to be approximately \$310,000.

Status of Health Insurance Fund and Financial Impact of Proposed Plan

When the City changed to the fully insured, high deductible plan combined with the HRA in calendar year 2010, the City Commission approved creation of a new Health Insurance Fund. This fund is designed to account for all health and vision insurance budgeted amounts from the General Fund, Water Services Fund and ECD Fund, as well as all employee payroll deductions for dependent coverage. All insurance premiums, medical, pharmacy and HRA claims are paid from this fund. The unaudited Health Insurance component of the Insurance Fund balance as of June 30, 2017 is \$1,859,032. This is an increase of \$400,000 above the 2016 fiscal year end balance. (See attachment A.)

Having a financially sound Health Insurance Fund provides the City flexibility when funding insurance costs for the upcoming 2019 fiscal year, which begins July 1, 2018. Normally, a self-funded plan with little or no financial reserves would need to budget an amount sufficient to meet the maximum liability. In the City's case, however, we have the ability to budget at an amount somewhere between the expected claims liability and calculated maximum claims liability, knowing that we have cash reserves to cover the maximum liability should claims reach

that level. Based on actual claims experience through the first ten months, total claims for 2017 are expected to be \$2,500,000 as projected. Of this amount approximately \$450,000 will be paid from the separate Post Retirement Benefits Fund for retiree medical claims and will not impact the Insurance Fund.

Accordingly, staff is currently projecting a 5% increase in the City's health insurance budget for FY 2019 beginning July 1, 2018. This increase is projected to be approximately \$145,000 across all three funds, with the General Fund's share being \$125,000.

Staff is also recommending a corresponding 2.5% increase in the employee's share of the insurance costs for dependent coverage effective January 1, 2018. This will increase funding by approximately \$12,000 and will affect employee payroll deductions as follows:

Staff Recommendation

Based upon the input received from our consultants at Sherrill Morgan and staff review of the City's group health insurance plan, the following recommendations are made for the 2018 plan year:

- 1. Increase the Specific Stop Loss attachment point from \$70,000 to \$75,000. This item is explained in detail in a separate, companion resolution that will be considered by the Board of Commissioners during the November 13, 2017 meeting.
- 2. Increase the employee cost share for dependent coverage by 2.5%, effective January 1, 2018, as described above. An increase in the City's share of funding for health insurance costs effective July 1, 2018, will be considered as part of the FY 2019 budget process.
- 3. Continue the current Wellness Program to focus on controlling medical claims expense through prevention and early intervention of illness and disease.

All other aspects of the group plan including deductible levels, doctor visit co-pay amounts, etc. will remain the same as in 2017.

Fiscal Impact:

With the projected 5% increase in the City's budgeted FY 2019 contributions to the Insurance Fund from all three contributing funds (General Fund, ECD, and Water and Sewer), the annual cost to the City will be slightly in excess of \$3 million. Additional annual funding to the Insurance Fund to pay claims and administrative expenses includes approximately \$600,000 in employee contributions for a share of dependent coverage, prescription rebates from Blue Cross/Blue Shield, and interest earnings.

Resolution 2017-81 - A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH BLUE RE OF TENNESSEE FOR 2018 STOP LOSS COVERAGE, for adoption

Background

Stop loss insurance or "reinsurance" is catastrophic insurance that is purchased in conjunction with a partially self-insured medical plan. This coverage is designed to limit the City's maximum liability for medical claims paid by our partially self-insured plan. It includes two major components, with the first being the most important protection:

Specific Stop Loss Coverage – This coverage limits the City's potential liability for a single member's catastrophic claims throughout the plan year. Specific stop loss insurance covers all costs of an individual's claims above a predetermined dollar amount (i.e. \$70,000-\$75,000).

Aggregate Stop Loss Coverage – Similar to the specific stop loss coverage for individual claims, the aggregate stop loss is an insurance policy that caps the City's total liability for all claims in the entire plan year at an agreed upon dollar amount called the "attachment point." Once total claims for the entire plan reach this attachment point, the aggregate stop loss insurance begins paying all additional claims costs for the entire plan. The attachment point is determined by the stop loss carrier's underwriters and is usually based on the plan's expected claims amount for the year plus a "risk corridor" or factor, for example 20-25%.

Aggregating Specific Coverage – Beginning in 2013, the City also selected an optional feature to the reinsurance policy called "aggregating specific" coverage. This option allows the City to take on an additional amount of claims liability in return for an equivalent amount of premium reduction. In 2014, the City assumed additional liability of \$75,000 of aggregating specific coverage. Under the current aggregating specific option, the City still has the same specific deductible of \$70,000 for every member of the plan. However, the City is not reimbursed when someone goes over the specific deductible until some combination of members (it could be one person, or three, or ten) go over their specific deductibles by a total of \$75,000.

For example, with the aggregating specific feature, if three individuals each had specific claims of \$100,000 (\$300,000 total), the City would pay the first \$70,000 of each claim (\$210,000 total) leaving the stop loss carrier to pay the remaining \$90,000. With the aggregating specific option, the City still pays the first \$70,000 of each claim (\$210,000 combined) plus the first \$75,000 of the remaining \$90,000. This would satisfy the aggregating specific limit, leaving the stop loss carrier to pay the remaining \$15,000. After the aggregating specific limit is satisfied one time, the plan is reimbursed for all claims for everyone else who exceeds the \$70,000 specific deductible. Because the City is essentially given an equivalent amount of guaranteed premium reduction in exchange for additional potential liability, the "worst-case" scenario for the City is that it will pay out no more than it would have without the aggregating specific option. The "best-case" scenario would be that the City saves \$75,000 in premium.

Annually, the City requests competitive proposals for stop loss insurance to ensure we continue to receive the most competitive rates available for this important coverage. In soliciting quotes for stop loss coverage for 2018, the City sought quotes for coverage that matched the existing 2017 coverage of \$70,000 specific deductible and the \$75,000 "aggregating specific" option. In addition, we requested that proposals include two features that are considered very important to the City in controlling long-term costs to the plan. Specifically, preferred proposals would include a renewal year (next year) rate cap or maximum, and an agreement that no plan member can be excluded from stop loss coverage or assigned a higher stop loss maximum based on high claims experience in the next plan renewal year. (This provision is referred to as "no new lasers.")

Proposals were requested in September 2017 for the 2018 plan year. Only three insurance companies submitted responses to the City's request for competitive quotes. A spreadsheet summarizing the total cost components of the proposals is attached. Blue Re, the City's current provider of stop loss coverage, submitted the lowest quote with a 9.77% cost increase. By accepting the quote from Blue Re, the cost of this coverage would increase approximately \$36,200 for the 2018 plan year. The other two proposers were not considered competitive.

Blue Re also submitted a proposal with a \$75,000 specific deductible at a cost increase of 2.64%, or \$9,800 more than the cost of our current policy with a \$70,000 specific deductible. Accepting this proposal would result in \$26,400 in premium savings compared to the renewal proposal with a \$70,000 specific deductible.

During the past three years, the plan has experienced five claims in each year that have exceeded \$70,000. Assuming we have the same number of large claims (exceeding \$70,000) in 2018, the premium savings would offset the increase in liability. However, for each additional large claim over \$70,000 the City would be responsible for an additional \$5,000 on each.

Based on an analysis of all proposals submitted by the vendors, as well as the service

capabilities of the companies, City staff and the City's insurance consultant, Sherrill Morgan, recommend accepting the contract with Blue Re for stop loss coverage for calendar year 2018 with a \$75,000 specific deductible and the \$75,000 aggregating specific provision.

APPROVAL OF PAYMENT OF CREDIT RATING FEE TO S&P GLOBAL RATINGS

Background

As discussed with the Commission recently, the proposed federal tax reform plan under consideration in Congress includes a provision that, if approved, would prohibit local government advance refunding bond issues beginning in 2018. An advance refunding bond issue is a tool used by local governments to take advantage of lower interest rate markets to refund existing bonds that are not yet callable. The proceeds of such a bond issue are used to fund an escrow account managed by an independent third party that pays off the original bonds as they become callable in the future.

Prior to the release of the proposed tax plan, staff had been in early discussions with our financial advisor about a potential advance refunding opportunity, and had tentatively scheduled early 2018 to proceed with the transaction. This transaction would refund a portion of a 2010 Water and Sewer bond issue and a portion of a 2011 G.O. bond issue with an estimated net present value savings (net of all costs) of approximately \$261,000 based on current market trends (see attached).

Given the proposed tax plan provisions, we are proposing to expedite this transaction and plan to have the refunding bond issue authorization on your November 27, 2017 agenda with a bond sale date tentatively scheduled for November 30, 2017. A complicating factor in the timing of this transaction is the fact the federal debt limit is scheduled to expire on December 15 and there is uncertainty around whether the U.S. Treasury will issue any State and Local Government Securities (SLGS) after December 8. The SLGS are the instruments used to fund the escrow account for an advance refunding.

Normally, the process starts with the City Commission approval of the bond resolution, which includes a detailed list of issuance costs including the rating agency fees for Moody's and S&P's. However, to meet this expedited schedule for this advance refunding, the City needs to begin the rating agency review process prior to adoption of the bond resolution by the City Commission. Part of the process for the S&P rating review is an engagement letter acknowledging that the City agrees to pay S&P a rating fee of \$14,000. Since this fee exceeds \$10,000, approval of the City Commission is required before the City Manager can authorize S&P to begin the rating process.

Note that Moody's does not have the same requirement for a formal engagement letter prior to the rating process, so no additional approval is necessary for the Moody's rating.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends City Commission approval of payment of the \$14,000 fee to S&P Global Ratings.

In consideration of our analytic review and issuance of the credit rating, you agree to pay us the following fees:

<u>Rating Fee.</u> You agree to pay us a credit rating fee of \$14,000 plus all applicable value-added, sale, use and similar taxes. S&P Global Ratings reserves the right to adjust the credit rating fee if the proposed par amount changes. Payment of the credit rating fee is not conditioned on S&P Global Ratings issuance of any particular credit rating.

<u>Derivatives Products Analysis Fee.</u> S&P Global Ratings charges a separate fee for our review of derivative products. This separate fee is applicable for derivative products secured by any of the issuer's revenues.
