Beer Law Violation Hearing - 55 South, 7031 Executive Center Drive

Background

In conjunction with a joint operation carried out by the Brentwood Police Department and the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission, an underage informant purchased beer at 55 South on February 27, 2018, at approximately 8:00 p.m. The employee who served the informant has been charged with a Class A misdemeanor. Separately, the Brentwood Beer Board is empowered to take action against the restaurant for violating Tennessee law and/or the Brentwood Municipal Code.

A summons (copy attached) was served on the manager of 55 South on April 17, 2018, requiring an appearance before the Beer Board on June 14, 2018 at 5:00 p.m.. A suggested procedural format used in previous Beer Board proceedings is also attached. A questionnaire was received from the permit holder indicating that the permit holder does not wish to contest the charges. It also includes documentation showing measures that were in place to prevent the sale of beer to minors and subsequent measures that have been taken to prevent future occurrences.

Since 55 South is not contesting the charges, there is no need for an evidentiary hearing in this matter. To supplement the documentation provided to the City, representatives may also make statements to the Beer Board at the June 14 hearing. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Beer Board will then discuss and vote upon the appropriate penalty, if any, to be imposed.

For the sale of beer to a minor at this location, the Beer Board may suspend the beer permit. (If a permit holder has committed at least two violations within a 12-month period, the Beer Board may permanently revoke the beer permit. That is not the case in this matter.) At the time a suspension or revocation is imposed, state law authorizes the Beer Board to offer the permit holder the alternative of paying a civil penalty in lieu of the suspension or revocation. For the offense of selling beer to a minor, the civil penalty may not exceed \$2,500. If a civil penalty is offered as an alternative, a permit holder must pay the penalty within seven days; otherwise, the suspension or revocation will go into effect.

In 2002, the Beer Board adopted guidelines for penalties to be imposed when beer permit holders violate the beer laws. Those guidelines are also attached. The guidelines are intended to provide for consistency in the way beer law violations are handled, although the Beer Board has discretion to impose penalties other than those outlined in the guidelines.

Finally, when the sale of beer for on-premises consumption results in a suspension or revocation by a local beer board, state law requires that notification of the beer board's action be sent by certified mail to the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission (ABC). The ABC may then take further action against the permit holder.

- 1. Chairman calls case number and permit holder's name: Case No. BBB-2018-01, 55 South.
- 2. Chairman asks permit holder's representative to step forward and identify him/herself.
- 3. Chairman reads the charges against the permit holder: The Chief of Police and the City Manager of the City of Brentwood have brought the following charges: On the 27th day of February, 2018, your employee or agent, Rachel Audretch, unlawfully sold beer to a person under the age of 21 years at 55 South, located at 7031 Executive Center Drive.
- 4. Chairman states: In documents filed with the Beer Board, 55 South has indicated that it does not wish to contest the charges brought against it. We have also received documentation of measures that were in place to prevent the sale of beer to minors and subsequent measures that have been taken to prevent future occurrences. Do you have any further statements you wish to make to the Beer Board that related to this matter?
- 5. Following the representative's statement (if any) the chairman and other members of the Beer Board (upon being recognized by the chairman) may ask questions of the representative.
- 6. Following questions and discussion by the Beer Board members, any member may move to impose a penalty (or that no penalty be imposed.) The penalty may be based on the penalty guidelines adopted by the Beer Board, or it may deviate from the guidelines at the Beer Board's discretion. A motion to suspend or revoke a permit should state the date on which the suspension or revocation is to be effective. Upon a second to the motion and any further discussion, a vote is taken on the motion. The motion passes if a majority of the board members present and voting vote for the motion.

RELATED OFFENSE

NARRATIVE-

- 1. On February 27, 2018, BPD Detective Breedlove assisted agents of the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC) with an underage alcohol sales investigation. TABC agents used the assistance of a confidential informant (CI) under the age of 21, who attempted to purchase alcohol at a number of businesses within the city of Brentwood. The CI was under direct supervision of undercover TABC agents during each purchase attempt.
- 2. At approximately 8:00pm on 2/27/2018 the CI was served a can of Bold Rock hard cider at 55 South, located at 7031 Executive Center Drive. Bartender Rachel AUDRETCH did not check the CI's identification card, but served the CI the alcoholic beverage. The sale was witnessed by two TABC special agents working in an undercover capacity.
- 3. TABC enforcement agents approached AUDRETCH and identified themselves to her, and issued a State of Tennessee Misdemeanor Citation to her for the sale, which is a violation of TCA 57-4-203.
- TABC agents also issued an administrative citation to the business for violations of TABC rules & regulations under TCA 57-4-203.
- 5. Detective Breedlove did not see the establishment's City of Brentwood Beer Permit displayed anywhere inside the business, so he asked the manager on duty where it was. The manager went to a non-public area of the business and retrieved the permit and showed it to Det. Breedlove, who then photographed the Beer Permit and later attached the photograph to this Incident Report.
- 6. This investigation is closed by exception prosecuted by other agency.

NARRATIVE

BRENTWOOD BEER BOARD PENALTY GUIDELINES (Adopted April 22, 2002)

The following guidelines are intended to provide standards to the Brentwood Beer Board in imposing penalties for violations of state or local beer laws and regulations in a fair, reasonable and consistent manner. These guidelines are not intended to dictate the penalty to be imposed, but rather to provide guidance to the members of the Board in their decisions. For each violation heard by the Beer Board, the Board will continue to have complete discretion to exercise any and all powers granted by state law and local ordinance. In each case, the Board may agree that a greater or lesser penalty should be imposed due to aggravating or mitigating circumstances.

In applying the penalties below, it is suggested that if no violations have occurred within the previous three years, the incident will be treated as a first violation. The "alternative" penalties set forth below would be allowed only if the Beer Board deems that the permit holder had appropriate training and/or other preventative measures in place to prevent violations of the beer laws, and that appropriate steps will be taken to prevent future violations. As a condition of the alternative penalty, the Beer Board may require the permit holder to submit documentation regarding training programs in place. It is suggested that the penalty period begin one week following the Beer Board's decision, in order to provide time for the permit holder to comply with the conditions of the alternative penalty.

Note: At the time of adoption of these guidelines, Tennessee law also provided that the Beer Board may offer a permit holder the alternative of paying a monetary penalty of up to \$1,500 for the sale of beer to a minor, or up to \$1,000 for other violations. The maximum penalty for the sale of beer to a minor was subsequently increased to \$2,500. However, the Tennessee General Assembly also created a "Responsible Vendor" program for off-premises beer permit holders. The permit of an off-premises permit holder who complies with this program may not be suspended or revoked. However, a monetary penalty not to exceed \$1,000 may be imposed on a "Responsible Vendor" for the sale of beer to a minor or any other offense.

(a) Preventive Measures before the violation

As we opened in August of last year, we hired an opening service team and held training sessions on service, menu knowledge, policies, etc. One of these training sessions covered our alcohol service policy which is standard in our New Employee Handbook. Specific discussions were on not serving minors, not serving an intoxicated Guest, ID recognition, common issues in dealing with intoxicated Guests, refusing service/cutting off Guests, common practices used by the public to "trick" us, and our responsibility to the Guest and the community. We had 100% employee and manager attendance for this training.

Moving forward from our opening, all newly hired employees are required to attend a New Hire Orientation conducted by the General Manager. One of the subjects that is covered is Alcohol Responsibility. We go through the Employee Handbook which states our policy and this is discussed with the new employee and they must sign that they have received this specific training.

We have a notebook where all ABC cards are kept and it is audited every month by the manager. We have been 100% compliant.

We have a Team Communication Board in the common server area. On this states the current Drinking Age Date which is updated daily. We keep the book of state ID's in the bar area which is easy accessible to servers and bartenders if/when they need it.

Our team benefits from a daily "line up" where we discuss any product changes/availability, celebrate accomplishments, menu training, alcohol training, etc.

These are held twice a day and a staple piece of information is the Drinking Age Date.

(b) Did employee complete all required training?

Rachel has been in the restaurant business for close to 18 years, She attended the New Hire Orientation and has a signed written acknowledgement of our alcohol service policies in her employee file. She has had a valid ABC card since we hired her last July and and has always been current.

(c) Reasons the preventative measures failed?

I feel this was very poor judgement on the part of the employee. Rachel knows better and has all required knowledge of policies, laws, and procedures. Her extensive experience working in downtown Nashville and other alcohol-forward establishments has sharpened her awareness of these requirements and best practices.

That being said, as the General Manager I am searching for every reason of how one of my most trusted employees could have made such a huge error. I can surmise that although we have gone through all the training, certifications, and have ongoing communication about the seriousness of this, we still need more.

(d) Any subsequent measures taken since the violation.

In the effort to do more, we have put our failure in this matter on display for our team to learn from. We openly discuss the legal and social responsibility specifics of this with the team so that they never forget how serious this is and how serious we take it. Managers openly ask servers and bartenders what the Drinking Date is when they check in for their shifts. We have added the Drinking Date to the Home Screen of our point of sale system so they are exposed to it every time they ring in anything in the computer. It is updated daily as part of our management routine. In addition, we hosted a class for our service team in which an officer from the ABC provided more information and training. We had 100% attendance for this class.

BRENTWOOD BEER BOARD PENALTY GUIDELINES (Adopted April 22, 2002)

The following guidelines are intended to provide standards to the Brentwood Beer Board in imposing penalties for violations of state or local beer laws and regulations in a fair, reasonable and consistent manner. These guidelines are not intended to dictate the penalty to be imposed, but rather to provide guidance to the members of the Board in their decisions. For each violation heard by the Beer Board, the Board will continue to have complete discretion to exercise any and all powers granted by state law and local ordinance. In each case, the Board may agree that a greater or lesser penalty should be imposed due to aggravating or mitigating circumstances.

In applying the penalties below, it is suggested that if no violations have occurred within the previous three years, the incident will be treated as a first violation. The "alternative" penalties set forth below would be allowed only if the Beer Board deems that the permit holder had appropriate training and/or other preventative measures in place to prevent violations of the beer laws, and that appropriate steps will be taken to prevent future violations. As a condition of the alternative penalty, the Beer Board may require the permit holder to submit documentation regarding training programs in place. It is suggested that the penalty period begin one week following the Beer Board's decision, in order to provide time for the permit holder to comply with the conditions of the alternative penalty.

First violation	30 day suspension	One week suspension/post signs*
Second violation	45 day suspension	Two week suspension/post signs*
Third violation	60 day suspension	No alternative
Fourth violation	Revocation**	No alternative

^{*} See attached wording and specifications for sign to be posted at each entrance and on each beer cooler door.

Note: At the time of adoption of these guidelines, Tennessee law also provided that the Beer Board may offer a permit holder the alternative of paying a monetary penalty of up to \$1,500 for the sale of beer to a minor, or up to \$1,000 for other violations. The maximum penalty for the sale of beer to a minor was subsequently increased to \$2,500. However, the Tennessee General Assembly also created a "Responsible Vendor" program for off-premises beer permit holders. The permit of an off-premises permit holder who complies with this program may not be suspended or revoked. However, a monetary penalty not to exceed \$1,000 may be imposed on a "Responsible Vendor" for the sale of beer to a minor or any other offense.

Beer Law Violation Hearing - Hanabi Japanese Restaurant, 214 Ward Circle

Background

In conjunction with a joint operation carried out by the Brentwood Police Department and the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission, an underage informant purchased beer at Hanabi Japanese Restaurant on February 27, 2018, at approximately 5:15 p.m. The employee who served the informant has been charged with a Class A misdemeanor. Separately, the Brentwood Beer Board is empowered to take action against the restaurant for violating Tennessee law and/or the Brentwood Municipal Code.

A summons (copy attached) was served on the manager of Hanabi Japanese Restaurant on April 17, 2018, requiring an appearance before the Beer Board on June 14, 2018 at 5:00 p.m.. A suggested procedural format used in previous Beer Board proceedings is also attached. A questionnaire was returned by the permit holder indicating that the permit holder does not wish to contest the charges. It also includes documentation showing measures that were in place to prevent the sale of beer to minors and subsequent measures that have been taken to prevent future occurrences.

Since Hanabi Japanese Restaurant is not contesting the charges, there is no need for an evidentiary hearing in this matter. To supplement the documentation provided to the City, representatives may also make statements to the Beer Board at the June 14 hearing. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Beer Board will then discuss and vote upon the appropriate penalty, if any, to be imposed.

For the sale of beer to a minor at this location, the Beer Board may suspend the beer permit. (If a permit holder has committed at least two violations within a 12-month period, the Beer Board may permanently revoke the beer permit. That is not the case in this matter.) At the time a suspension or revocation is imposed, state law authorizes the Beer Board to offer the permit holder the alternative of paying a civil penalty in lieu of the suspension or revocation. For the offense of selling beer to a minor, the civil penalty may not exceed \$2,500. If a civil penalty is offered as an alternative, a permit holder must pay the penalty within seven days; otherwise, the suspension or revocation will go into effect.

In 2002, the Beer Board adopted guidelines for penalties to be imposed when beer permit holders violate the beer laws. Those guidelines are also attached. The guidelines are intended to provide for consistency in the way beer law violations are handled, although the Beer Board has discretion to impose penalties other than those outlined in the guidelines.

Finally, when the sale of beer for on-premises consumption results in a suspension or revocation by a local beer board, state law requires that notification of the beer board's action be sent by certified mail to the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission (ABC). The ABC may then take further action against the permit holder.

PENALTY GUIDELINES (Adopted April 22, 2002)

The following guidelines are intended to provide standards to the Brentwood Beer Board in imposing penalties for violations of state or local beer laws and regulations in a fair, reasonable and consistent manner. These guidelines are not intended to dictate the penalty to be imposed, but rather to provide guidance to the members of the Board in their decisions. For each violation heard by the Beer Board, the Board will continue to have complete discretion to exercise any and all powers granted by state law and local ordinance. In each case, the Board may agree that a greater or lesser penalty should be imposed due to aggravating or mitigating circumstances.

In applying the penalties below, it is suggested that if no violations have occurred within the previous three years, the incident will be treated as a first violation. The "alternative" penalties set forth below would be allowed only if the Beer Board deems that the permit holder had appropriate training and/or other preventative measures in place to prevent violations of the beer laws, and that appropriate steps will be taken to prevent future violations. As a condition of the alternative penalty, the Beer Board may require the permit holder to submit documentation regarding training programs in place. It is suggested that the penalty period begin one week following the Beer Board's decision, in order to provide time for the permit holder to comply with the conditions of the alternative penalty.

Beer Law Violation Hearing - Jefferson's Restaurant, 214 Ward Circle

Background

In conjunction with a joint operation carried out by the Brentwood Police Department and the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission, an underage informant purchased beer at Jefferson's Restaurant on February 27, 2018, at approximately 5:00 p.m. The employee who served the informant has been charged with a Class A misdemeanor. Separately, the Brentwood Beer Board is empowered to take action against the restaurant for violating Tennessee law and/or the Brentwood Municipal Code.

A summons (copy attached) was served on the manager of Jefferson's Restaurant on April 17, 2018, requiring an appearance before the Beer Board on June 14, 2018 at 5:00 p.m.. A suggested procedural format used in previous Beer Board proceedings is also attached. A questionnaire was returned by the permit holder indicating that the permit holder does not wish to contest the charges. It also includes documentation showing measures that were in place to prevent the sale of beer to minors and subsequent measures that have been taken to prevent future occurrences.

Since Jefferson's Restaurant is not contesting the charges, there is no need for an evidentiary hearing in this matter. To supplement the documentation provided to the City, representatives may also make statements to the Beer Board at the June 14 hearing. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Beer Board will then discuss and vote upon the appropriate penalty, if any, to be imposed.

For the sale of beer to a minor at this location, the Beer Board may suspend the beer permit. (If a permit holder has committed at least two violations within a 12-month period, the Beer Board may permanently revoke the beer permit. That is not the case in this matter.) At the time a suspension or revocation is imposed, state law authorizes the Beer Board to offer the permit holder the alternative of paying a civil penalty in lieu of the suspension or revocation. For the offense of selling beer to a minor, the civil penalty may not exceed \$2,500. If a civil penalty is offered as an alternative, a permit holder must pay the penalty within seven days; otherwise, the suspension or revocation will go into effect.

In 2002, the Beer Board adopted guidelines for penalties to be imposed when beer permit holders violate the beer laws. Those guidelines are also attached. The guidelines are intended to provide for consistency in the way beer law violations are handled, although the Beer Board has discretion to impose penalties other than those outlined in the guidelines.

Finally, when the sale of beer for on-premises consumption results in a suspension or revocation by a local beer board, state law requires that notification of the beer board's action be sent by certified mail to the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission (ABC). The ABC may then take further action against the permit holder.

In conjunction with a joint operation carried out by the Brentwood Police Department and the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission, an underage informant purchased beer at Local Taco on February 27, 2018, at approximately 9:00 p.m. The employee who served the informant has been charged with a Class A misdemeanor. Separately, the Brentwood Beer Board is empowered to take action against the restaurant for violating Tennessee law and/or the Brentwood Municipal Code.

A summons (copy attached) was served on the manager of Local Taco on April 17, 2018, requiring an appearance before the Beer Board on June 14, 2018 at 5:00 p.m.. A suggested procedural format used in previous Beer Board proceedings is also attached. A questionnaire was returned by the permit holder indicating that the permit holder does not wish to contest the charges. It also includes documentation showing measures that were in place to prevent the sale of beer to minors and subsequent measures that have been taken to prevent future occurrences.

Since Local Taco is not contesting the charges, there is no need for an evidentiary hearing in this matter. To supplement the documentation provided to the City, representatives may also make statements to the Beer Board at the June 14 hearing. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Beer Board will then discuss and vote upon the appropriate penalty, if any, to be imposed.

For the sale of beer to a minor at this location, the Beer Board may suspend the beer permit. (If a permit holder has committed at least two violations within a 12-month period, the Beer Board may permanently revoke the beer permit. That is not the case in this matter.) At the time a suspension or revocation is imposed, state law authorizes the Beer Board to offer the permit holder the alternative of paying a civil penalty in lieu of the suspension or revocation. For the offense of selling beer to a minor, the civil penalty may not exceed \$2,500. If a civil penalty is offered as an alternative, a permit holder must pay the penalty within seven days; otherwise, the suspension or revocation will go into effect.

In 2002, the Beer Board adopted guidelines for penalties to be imposed when beer permit holders violate the beer laws. Those guidelines are also attached. The guidelines are intended to provide for consistency in the way beer law violations are handled, although the Beer Board has discretion to impose penalties other than those outlined in the guidelines.

Finally, when the sale of beer for on-premises consumption results in a suspension or revocation by a local beer board, state law requires that notification of the beer board's action be sent by certified mail to the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission (ABC). The ABC may then take further action against the permit holder.

RELATED OFFENSE

NARRATIVE-

- 1. On February 27, 2018, BPD Detective Breedlove assisted agents of the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC) with an underage alcohol sales investigation. TABC agents used the assistance of a confidential informant (CI) under the age of 21, who attempted to purchase alcohol at a number of businesses within the city of Brentwood. The CI was under direct supervision of undercover TABC agents during each purchase attempt.
- 2. At approximately 6:50pm on 2/27/2018 the CI was served a glass of Zwickel beer at Stout Burgers & Beer located at 400 Centerview Drive. Server Sierrah SHIPMAN did not check the CI's identification card, but served the CI the glass of beer. The sale was witnessed by two TABC special agents working in an undercover capacity.
- 3. TABC enforcement agents approached SHIPMAN and identified themselves to her, and issued a State of Tennessee Misdemeanor Citation to her for the sale, which is a violation of TCA 57-4-203.
- 4. TABC agents also issued an administrative citation to the business for violations of TABC rules & regulations under TCA 57-4-203.
- 5. Detective Breedlove photographed the establishment's City of Brentwood Beer Permit, which was displayed in a place that could be observed by the public, and has attached the photograph to this Incident Report.
- 6. This investigation is closed by exception prosecuted by other agency.

NARRATIVE

1. Reference is made to the original Incident Report by Det. Breedlove in this investigative case file.

BRENTWOOD BEER BOARD PENALTY GUIDELINES (Adopted April 22, 2002)

The following guidelines are intended to provide standards to the Brentwood Beer Board in imposing penalties for violations of state or local beer laws and regulations in a fair, reasonable and consistent manner. These guidelines are not intended to dictate the penalty to be imposed, but rather to provide guidance to the members of the Board in their decisions. For each violation heard by the Beer Board, the Board will continue to have complete discretion to exercise any and all powers granted by state law and local ordinance. In each case, the Board may agree that a greater or lesser penalty should be imposed due to aggravating or mitigating circumstances.

In applying the penalties below, it is suggested that if no violations have occurred within the previous three years, the incident will be treated as a first violation. The "alternative" penalties set forth below would be allowed only if the Beer Board deems that the permit holder had appropriate training and/or other preventative measures in place to prevent violations of the beer laws, and that appropriate steps will be taken to prevent future violations. As a condition of the alternative penalty, the Beer Board may require the permit holder to submit documentation regarding training programs in place. It is suggested that the penalty period begin one week following the Beer Board's decision, in order to provide time for the permit holder to comply with the conditions of the alternative penalty.

Note: At the time of adoption of these guidelines, Tennessee law also provided that the Beer Board may offer a permit holder the alternative of paying a monetary penalty of up to \$1,500 for the sale of beer to a minor, or up to \$1,000 for other violations. The maximum penalty for the sale of beer to a minor was subsequently increased to \$2,500. However, the Tennessee General Assembly also created a "Responsible Vendor" program for off-premises beer permit holders. The permit of an off-premises permit holder who complies with this program may not be suspended or revoked. However, a monetary penalty not to exceed \$1,000 may be imposed on a "Responsible Vendor" for the sale of beer to a minor or any other offense.

^{**} In order to impose revocation, there must be at least two violations within a 12-month period.
